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

Lahai Dental Clinic Finds Blessings Amidst the Flood

If you have ever experienced a water leak in your home, you know the damage it can do. On April 29th of this year at our dental clinic in Lynnwood, we got a personal reminder of how much water can destroy. We had a fire sprinkler malfunction in our compressor room, and it began spewing 60 gallons of water per minute for over 20 minutes. The water ran throughout our dental facility and most of our administration offices. The water damage rendered our facility unusable without major repair.

Our immediate focus after the flood became how to serve our scheduled patients without a dental facility. That's when our partners, Medical Teams International (MTI) stepped up and allowed us to use their mobile dental truck to complete treatment plans already in progress. These treatment plans were completed by the end of June, when we returned MTI's truck to them. Remediation and renovations took place all through the summer in our dental clinic and admin offices. While we had to operate within guidelines for an insurance claim, we were able to make several enhancements including new paint, and new flooring that is easier to clean and less maintenance. During our clinic's closure we were also given the opportunity to transition to a new electronic health record software. This new cloud-based software system is more efficient and minimizes service interruptions. The timing of our clinic shutdown resulted in significant time to train and adjust to the new software allowing us to better serve our patients moving forward.





We excitedly reopened the clinic at full capacity on September 23rd and have been serving patients in what feels like our shiny new facility ever since! In the end, what started as a disaster ended up being a blessing for Lahai and those we serve. We are grateful for the dental staff, good insurance coverage and skilled workers who helped keep our shutdown to a minimum.

Celebrating Growth in our Dental Team

Not only did our dental clinic receive a refresh this year, but so did our dental staff. Our previous dentist, Dr. Jenny Vu, moved out of state to take over a family practice. It was difficult to see her leave, but we fully supported this transition. That left us without a dentist over the summer during our clinic shut down. As we posted the job, we prayed for a candidate who had a heart for Lahai's mission. In August, our prayers were answered in the form of Dr. Lily Lou. She has an amazing heart for both the under-served and for God, and she speaks Mandarin in addition to English. Our clinic was still being renovated when she started, so she was able to focus on training on the new software and getting to know the team. Dr. Lou has been a phenomenal addition to our Lahai team, and we are so grateful she is here!

We have also had several other enhancements to our dental team during 2024. Dominique Robertson, and Evelyn Leonzon joined our staff this year as Dental Assistants. Dominique is bilingual in Spanish and English, and Evelyn is trilingual, speaking Tagalog, Arabic and English. We also have two returning staff members who each worked for us as Dental Assistants in the past and have returned to us in new capacities! Magali Flores, who is bilingual in Spanish and English, has returned as our Dental Administrator in dental reception, and Brook Boice returns to us as a Dental Hygienist having now completed hygiene school. Rounding out the team is Sonja Smith, who has been with us for six years and moved from being a Dental Assistant to being our Dental Coordinator. Altogether, our dental team speaks five languages, allowing us to serve many of our patients in their native tongue. Putting this team together with our dental volunteers means great outcomes for our patients in need of oral care.



In the end, we can confidently say God is good all the time! He showed us how to receive many blessings in the face of adversity. Our dental team is ready and eager to take on anything our patients require while showing compassion, care and the love of Christ in the process. We truly are blessed!
